GENERAL EVENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

16TH ANNUAL LIVING HISTORY AND REENACTMENT

APRIL 16-18, 2010

- All living historians and reenactors **must** register upon arrival for camp assignments and parking permit
- \$5 reenactor admission fee paid at time of registration
- Reenactors bringing **equine**, see Safety Manual for Living History Exhibits Demonstrations, and Reenactments; no equine will be unloaded without proof of current Coggins tests
- **Meals:**
 - All meals – except Saturday evening meal – responsibility of reenactors
 - Reenactor's meal provided by Friends of the Confederate Reunion Grounds for Saturday evening
- **Firewood** provided by Confederate Reunion Grounds; pickup at wood shed, as needed
- **Fire rings** available for use on “first come” basis (see Safety Manual for Living History Exhibits Demonstrations, and Reenactments for ground fire use); pickup at wood shed
- Please do not litter. Trash will be picked up by site staff each morning by 7:00 a.m.; place in secured trash bag on side of road
- **Hay:**
 - Hay for equine and livestock is responsibility of reenactors
 - Hay will be available for camp use only
- **Water** is available on site; water troughs will be located throughout site
- Reenactors bringing **pets and livestock**, see Safety Manual for Living History Exhibits Demonstrations, and Reenactments and Rules of Visitor Conduct
- For both historic interpretation and safety, access to the site by vehicles is strictly regulated; parking permits and rules and regulations will be provided during registration
- All **vehicles** must be parked in designated areas only. Vehicles are not allowed on the grounds during public hours. Any vehicle parked in unauthorized areas will be subject to towing.
- It is strongly encouraged that camps remain up throughout the entire event. Leaving early is allowed, but no tear down or load out of camps will be allowed during public hours.
- If you must leave early, make arrangements with staff to ensure a safe and orderly retreat.
- Any problem with a participant or visitor should be reported to the Event Provost, or, site staff.
- Any disorderly person, or individuals not adhering to all policies, rules, and regulations of the Texas Historical Commission will be removed from the event.
